FOR A SAFE AND ENJOYABLE VISIT

- Make sure everyone is wearing a helmet – including children in bicycle trailers!
- Be Bright, Stay to the Right
- Give Audible Warning Before Passing
- Keep One Ear Clear
- Protect Your Pet – 8-foot Leash (6 feet in Cuyahoga Valley National Park)
- Take Breaks to the Side of the Trail
- Slow Down
- Single File
- Do Not Block the Trail
- All Yield to Horses

CVSR Explorer! Bike, run and hike the trails one way and ride the train back. Flag down the train at any boarding station for a small fee or using your Explorer pass.

Check Trail Closures. Before you visit, check with park districts for closure updates. Please stay out of closed areas for everyone's safety.

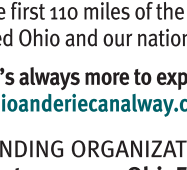
